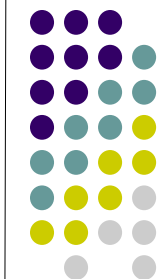

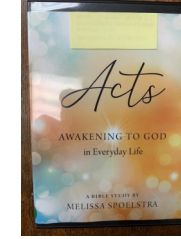

New Bible Study

Our Bible Study group meets on Wednesday mornings at 9:00 a.m. On June 6 we will begin a new program called "Acts: Awakening to God in Everyday Life." Insurance Claim: New Roof

You will see new shingles being installed on the roof of the church soon. A contractor will be removing the old shingles and installing new. The work is scheduled to begin in June.

Our insurance company, Church Mutual Insurance, discovered that our building sustained damage to the shingles on the roof from a severe wind storm in June, 2021. A claim was processed to repair the damage. The same storm surge damaged some of the electrical equipment in the church as well. The damage to our audio and video systems in the sanctuary and to our phone and computers have been repaired under the same insurance claim.

We are grateful for the good service that Church Mutual Insurance is providing. High quality shingles will be installed and the color will be similar to what we have. The church was built in 1978 with cedar wood shingles. Those were replaced with asphalt shingles about twenty years later. The flat roof portion of the church was replaced about fifteen years ago with modern roofing materials and is still in terrific condition.

Youth Mission Trip

Our youth group will participate in the Mission Immersion Program provided by the Maxwell Street Presbyterian church in Lexington, Kentucky, June 19-24. The church is located in the heart of the city.

The group will serve at several social service agencies in the city, including the city's food bank, childcare facilities, homeless shelters, and others. The experience allows participants to see social issues up close and to appreciate how our government and nonprofit agencies work hard to fill the unmet needs of God's people day after day.



We will commission the mission trip youth during worship on June 19: Trent Betka, Waylon Lee, Abby Steiner, and Ethan Steiner. Sadie Hofer (Youth Group Director) and Rev. Wade will attend as well. Sadie has planned the trip and will be leading the group.

Please pray for our group as they head out to see and serve in Christ's name.

Church Garden

Our beautiful flower and vegetable garden is about all planted now. We thank those growing vegetables this year: Rita Carter, Skip and Melissa Betka, Larry and Gloria Jahn, Pat Catron, and Wade.

We have several plots of perennial flowers which we cut occasionally and take to those who might need some flowers of encouragement. We thank Pat Catron for tending to the flower plots all year long.

Our gardeners have garlic, strawberries, cucumbers, tomatoes, Indian corn, and much more growing in our 24 plots.

Our Garden of Eden is a peaceful place but requires ongoing work and care. May God give us rain as needed and encourage the weeds to grow elsewhere!

Our **July 17** mission offering will support the Hoopeston Area Rescue Team, our non-profit animal shelter that rescues stray dogs and cats here in town, tends to their needs, and places them in new homes. HART is a no-kill shelter run by faithful volunteers.

Pentecost Offering

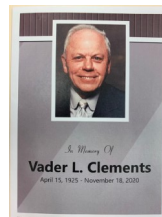
